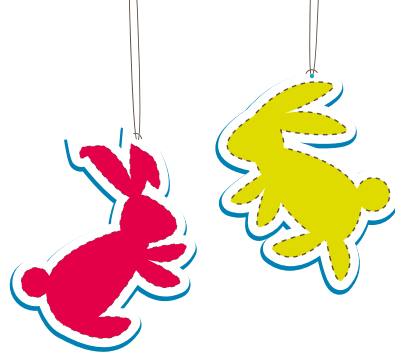

## EASTER BASKET ACTIVITY TO PRACTICE 'HAVE GOT'

### Materials:

- Prepared version of Worksheet 1 to show to pupils.
  - A copy of Worksheet 1 per pupil.
  - Crayons/colouring pens.
1. Show the Easter basket you've prepared with different coloured Easter eggs. Give a copy of the Easter egg basket worksheet to each child.
  2. The children cut out the basket and colour the eggs in colours of their choice. They use Blu Tack to stick the eggs to the basket.
  3. Ask "Have you got a (red) egg?" The children respond. (Yes, I have./No, I haven't.)
  4. Individual children hold up their baskets and say "Look! I've got (two) (yellow) eggs."
  5. Demonstrate the role play with a child, using imaginary Easter eggs. "Look. I've two red eggs and one yellow egg. / Oh, can I have a red egg, please? / Yes, of course. Here you are. Happy Easter! / Thank you." Repeat once or twice inviting two different children to take your place.
  6. The children do the role play in pairs. They change roles and repeat.
  7. Demonstrate acting out the role play using the Easter basket. The children repeat the role play in pairs using their baskets. (Optional) They can change partners to do this.

## EASTER VIDEO

### Materials:

- A copy of worksheet 2 for you.
1. Mime and say the words - "Easter egg" (make an egg shape); "Easter rabbit" (put hands at top of head like a rabbit's ears); "flower" (hold and smell a bunch of flowers); "chick" (move elbows like a chick's wings); "basket" (hold and take things out of a basket). Repeat. The children listen, mime and say the words with you.
  2. Hold up worksheet 2 for children to see. Say "look at the photos. it's Easter! in the first photo the children are on an Easter egg hunt. They're looking for Easter eggs." check understanding and explain.
  3. Ask "What can you see in the photo? is there a basket?" (Yes.) "is there an Easter rabbit?" (No.) Play the video. The children listen and look for the five items from step 1.
  4. Play the video again. The children mime and sing the repeated lines. They wave their arms when they sing Hurray! Repeat once or twice.
